## CrossWalk in Washington D.C.

The Saturday before Labor Day I flew to Washington D. C. to meet up with Meighan Pritchard and the *Cross-Walk America* group as they finished their five month journey across the country. What a joyous time! On Saturday evening, I was able to join about 90 others for a celebration dinner. As I sat with Meighan and heard just a few of her multitude of stories, I was deeply moved by her accomplishment. Starting on Easter Sunday, she and six others, plus support crew, covered over 2,500 miles, and talked with people of an extremely wide variety of theological perspectives about their faith.

A common response Meighan heard was, "I never knew there could be this kind of wonderful Christianity." Another was, "You're walking for me." Of course she also heard the other side, "We disagree," or even more sharply, "You can't be a real Christian and believe the *Phoenix Affirmations*." The Meighan I saw in Washington D.C. was a changed woman who was joyful and talkative about her faith and about her journey.

On Sunday, I joined a large group of folks to walk the final mile of this amazing pilgrimage. There, in that large crowd, I met up with the minister and some others from the church in D.C. where Joan Davis' parents attend, as well as some friends of Bob Fitzgerald and Helen Bereiter from Arizona, and some folks I had met on the bike ride we did last spring. What a wonderful gathering. The rally on Sunday at the Methodist Church was a fitting celebration of the Walk.

Some of the most important things I experienced were the joy of supporting Meighan who took this journey on behalf of so many (and how proud I am that our church has been in the center of this walk and these progressive voices of faith) and the joy I experienced hearing such strong, loving and hopeful images of Christianity projected so clearly. Meighan is scheduled to arrive home on **Sept. 19**, and we will schedule forums with her as soon as possible. Congratulations Meighan, and thank you, congregation.

## Thanks Be to God for Elders' Gifts

**V** A recent article in the *The Seattle Times* religion section was captioned, "no matter how much busywork we do, our divine call remains." I was struck by how true that has been for me. Many of you know that I left my work as a university professor at the age of 56 to return to Seattle to care for my mother who was declining from dementia. It involved a risk to leap into the unknown. What was I to be? What was I to do?

That journey became a gift in so many ways. Not only was I able to accompany my mother through her final years and her dying, I was at last able to focus my energies in a new direction. Since my divorce in my mid-40s, I had heard a deep call to do healing work in the world. As a busy professor and author, I had some time for God but could not imagine leaving what I was doing. But now I had time. My answer to that call was to complete a Master of Arts in Transforming Spirituality at Seattle University and to become a commissioned minister of University Congregational United Church of Christ, focusing on spiritual direction and the spirituality of aging.

Twenty of our youth have interviewed a number of our members who are 80 years old or over. ## The Journey Is Home

**V** One of my favorite hymns is written by Ruth Duck and found in the hymn book, *Everflowing Streams*.

"Lead On O Cloud of Yahweh, the exodus is come. In wilderness and desert our tribe shall make its home.... We are not lost though wandering, for by your light we come, and we are still God's people, the journey is our home."

I've been pondering a perspective shared by the rec- tor at Tantur, the ecumenical program in Jerusalem that Tim and I participated in during June. He talked about a way of differentiating between tourists and pilgrims. Tourists look at the scenery, at the people, at the situa- tions. But from a distance.

Pilgrims don't pass through the land, but allow the land to pass through them, and its people to pass through one's self. A pilgrim asks, "what are God's questions?" and seeks to form relationships. A pilgrim doesn't see the local people as objects to fill out a scene, but as people with a story to tell. He encouraged us to be pilgrims, to form relationships, to be moved by the stories and lives of those present, and to set aside preconceptions and judgments to see the face of God in all we meet.

The month in the Holy Land stays with me in pow- erful and interesting ways. As I recently re-read the words of the hymn, "Lead on, O Cloud of Yahewh," I heard anew God's call to be a pilgrim in this journey of life, even (or especially) here at home. To listen to sto- ries. To honor God's presence in each person I meet. To be willing to ask, "what are God's questions?" in chal- lenging or poignant or wonderful experiences. May I continue to hold on to that call to a way of life, and with the assurance of God's presence in the journey and in the questions. Thanks be to God!
